The Art of Shola Flowers and Chaand Mala: A Hands-On Workshop

During any religious festival, particularly Durga Puja, 'shola' decorations and the ubiquitous 'chaandmala' is seen in almost each of the pandals. However, the work and effort which occurs behind the scenes is rarely noticed.

The 'shola flower and chaandmala' making workshop which we, the members of Artitude participated in, allowed us to gain the first-hand experience of the skill required to make various decorative ornaments for this festival.

These delicate pieces, typically used during festivals like Durga Puja and Saraswati Puja, are made from shola wood, a soft material sourced from the bark of plants native to Bangladesh, Indonesia, and India.

The workshop was led by Mr. Sukumar Mondal, an artisan with 26 years of experience. He demonstrated how the outer bark is removed to reveal the soft wood inside, which is then carved into beautiful flowers and designs. Emphasizing the eco-friendly nature of the craft, Mr. Mondal highlighted that only recyclable materials are used—no plastic is involved. We found the experience both educational and eye-opening. This hands-on workshop taught us a new skill and its sustainability. We also appreciated the artistry behind this traditional craftsmanship that blends beauty with cultural heritage.


Our sketches showcase the unique beauty of the environment. Learning about the entire process of the creation of the idol and seeing it in person was an insightful and enriching experience for all of us.


Literati Journalism Workshop

There's something so life changing about religion,


The way everyone loves each other in the temple,

Dancing for Durga Maa: A Spiritual Journey


